Comments & Recommendations:

Fire hydrant. Please provide the location of the nearest fire hydrant, and if more than 400 feet from the building, an on-site fire hydrant shall be provided.

Fire apparatus maneuvering. Please provide a maneuvering sketch of the 6-Tower fire apparatus to demonstrate turning radius compliance in the new parking lot.

Fire Zone. Please indicate stripping and signage to identify fire zones and to prohibit the obstruction thereof by the parking of vehicles (along the driveway access and on the northside of the synagogue).

Address identification. Indicate on the plans the building address identification number to be legible and placed in a position that is clearly visible from the street fronting the property, not less than 6-inches in height, 1-inch in width, contrast color with the background and reflective.

Knox box. Indicate on the plans the location of the knox box placed in a conspicuous location.

Utilities. Clearly marked to I.D. and show locations of gas shutoff valves, electric meter, services switches and other utility equipment.

Please indicate the location of the garbage dumpster in the parking lot, if applicable.
